Francesca was born in Colombia, South America. Her father was a local artist and her mother was a French pianist. Francesca studied Arts in Bogotá.



About

- Already, her early works have a strong spontaneity, a human-passion story that has arisen between the many countries she has
 lived and traveled in, but also and the existential challenges she has encountered. Her abstract paintings are regarded by collectors
 as a perfect combination of tradition and contemporary, Western and Far East, which has a very literatial temperament. Their lively
 style and the spontaneousness of her artistic creation have always kept her works alive. In particular, she draws inspiration from
 American abstract behavior painting, transforming into her expression and techniques. In her paintings there are twists and turns,
 sprays and hand brushes giving the imagination that her art erupts freely from the body.
- Having been displaced and in exile for political reasons with the aftermath of constant onslaught of extreme emotions, she had to
 learn how to cope and channel these experiences. Francesca is now living between France and China, creates her work in a stunning
 release of such tensions. And exactly this release is the magical transmission we encounter in her artworks.
- The artist invites the audience in a minimalist way to immerse into the artworks' scanning lines drawn from the boundary between the strength and weakness of air movements, In these sometimes violent expressions, we find our own passions and emotions.
- In China and Japan, Francesca Mitterrand's works are widely recognized and are frequently exhibited in museums, art galleries and fairs, including the most prestigious galleries in the Far East.
- She lately started a new series of artworks on cloth, "painting" on it by using raw cashmere wool material spreading it (seemingly) at random over the canvas of cloth, and then using a Mongolian traditional handcrafting method to press the natural material into the shape of long scarfs. The scarfs patterns congenially communicate with her actual paintings.
- Here she is collaborating with the Mongolian brand SAND RIVER as her sponsor.
- In June, Francesca will participate in the Gobi Heaven Art Festival, exhibiting her art and doing a workshop showing the Mongolian scarf handicraft to the art visitors.




